

The wonder of the word of God: A lamp for my feet and light to my path

I saw an orienteering race recently, but it was a bit different. It was in the dark and everyone was wearing head torches and reading crumpled up maps as they ran. I've never done one — I'd be worried about tripping over! I'm already terrified that someone is going to fall on the steps outside our house as the lights there don't work at the moment. Going down them in the dark is quite perilous. You end up dangling your foot over the edge of the step to find out where you can safely put your foot down. With a light on it, you have confidence where the step starts and where it ends and where the side edges are too.

Psalm 119v105 says that the Bible, God's word, is a lamp for my feet and a light for my path. A lamp for your feet is something you take with you. A light to your path could be placed on a stand showing where the path goes. Both are really helpful in the dark. Whether you're unsure of your footing on a dark staircase or whether you're running with a crumpled up map in one hand!

The Bible is God's light to guide us. It brings revelation, clarity and instruction. It is the ultimate authoritative revelation from God about the best way to live and how to live in relationship with Him. It points us to Jesus the living word. It is the maker's instructions. It really is essential to making the most of life and to living in the way that we were created to live. It also contains essential instructions which need to be followed prior to the end of life on this earth too. When we do follow the Bible, it gives us an incredible divine peace to know that we are following God's instructions.

We could all do with a bit of extra light at this time of year. I pray that our series on the Bible lightens up our lives as we begin the new year and that it gives us fresh insight by the inspiration of God's Holy Spirit and the love of Jesus in our hearts.

Gobaith Môn

Gobaith Môn is a Christian youth initiative established by the churches of Anglesey around 10 years ago. Gobaith Môn aims to gather Christians from all denominations to bring hope to the young people of Anglesey by encouraging and developing youth work in schools, churches and communities and by valuing each young person, by being inclusive in community and by encouraging the local church. Gobaith Môn is a Scripture Union Local Mission Partner.

Amy Turner, the Gobaith Môn Youth Worker and lead co-ordinator, grew up in Penrallt. She is currently working with Ysgol Uwchradd Caergybi in Holyhead and Ysgol Syr Thomas Jones in Amlwch. In the school in Holyhead, Gobaith Môn has office space which provides somewhere for children to go if they need someone to talk to. Amy teaches year 7 and 8 PSE (Personal and Social Education) lessons. In the autumn term these focused on morality, how we decide what is right and wrong, and spiritual development. Amy also attends the weekly games club and leads assemblies for years 7 to 11.

In Amlwch, Amy has been teaching year 7 on the topic of bullying, and hopes to teach year 8 in the spring term. Gobaith Môn also took their football cage to the community day in Llanddaniel held at Ysgol Parc Y Bont.

Gobaith Môn has highlighted the following prayer points:

- Continued favour: Pray for favour in all secondary schools on Ynys Môn
- Growth: Grow the team (more workers) and grow the financial support for Gobaith Môn
- Protection: For the students, staff, and Gobaith Môn team
