Feeling powerless? Trust that God can use you, and step out in faith

We have recently noted that it has been a whole year since Russia invaded Ukraine. This feels very sad. There is so much to honour in the resistance of the people of Ukraine, and so much to lament also in the suffering that has been caused and the suffering that continues. The war and the political crisis show few signs of ending. It's easy to feel powerless. However, we can pray. We have seen amazing transformations in our world in our lifetimes. As Christians, we believe in the power of prayer. We believe in hope.

Perhaps we are also feeling powerless in some of our own situations. However, we should never be without hope. In our current morning service series, we are looking at Gideon. Gideon felt powerless in his situation, but he was called by God. He struggled to believe that anyone could make a difference in his situation, least of all him! But he stepped out in faith. He gradually built confidence and continued to be affirmed in his calling by those around him. He continued to step out in faith — and he kept coming back to God to confirm that he was hearing God correctly. God did something amazing through him to save his people. Gideon was far from perfect, particularly as time went on. We can learn from his successes and from his failures, but most importantly Gideon points us to the one perfect saviour.

Praise God for Jesus. He perfectly heard his father's voice. He only ever did his father's will. God worked through him to perform many beautiful and wondrous miracles and healings, to build faith and to teach and to reveal God the father to us. He restored people physically, mentally and emotionally. And most of all he restored people spiritually by dying for us on a cross.

Then he pours out the Holy Spirit upon us. Jesus enables us step out in faith and to follow the individual calling that God has for us. To make a difference — in the name of Jesus and in his love.

Focus on...

Claire Bedford Serving with BMS in Chad



Claire Bedford has been in N'Djamena in Chad, West Africa since January 2016, following a year of French language study in France. Claire is working for BMS at Guinebor 2 hospital.

In the UK Claire worked as a hospital pharmacist and latterly as a prescribing advisor for GP practices. Claire's role in Chad is to continue the development of the pharmacy service at Guinebor 2 hospital. As well as having supervisory oversight of the pharmacy and the lab, Claire is part of the Senior Management Team (SMT) alongside other long-term mission workers.



Over 15,000 people were seen at Guinbor 2 during 2022. An average of 194 babies were born and 94 operations were carried out each month. The hospital continues to welcome many patients from all over N'Djamena, the rest of Chad and also from neighbouring countries, demonstrating the confidence people have in the care the hospital gives. Pray that this is a great witness to the patients of the love of Jesus in action.

Claire reports that the SMT meets every Friday and rarely finish everything they need to discuss whether that's HR, finance, legal or infrastructure issues. They're grateful to the team of Chadian heads of department who ensure the day to day running of the hospital. The SMT recently hosted the annual hospital board meetings. There were some visitors from a couple different donor organisations (including BMS) and others joined online. The first of three meetings was with Chadian government officials both from the Ministry of Health and the NGO office. This was the first time they'd had a meeting like this since January 2020 (just pre-covid). It was good to hear the thoughts and views of the officials and also their overall positive impression of, and gratitude for, the hospital.

Patience was required regarding the Swiss financing the new large solar system, in that it took them a rather long time to wire the first part of their donation to Guinebor 2. Two months in fact! But the hospital is grateful that the first tranche is now in their account and purchasing of all the components can begin.

The current pharmacist, Audrey is moving to a government hospital on 3rd March and so Cleopas has now formally taken over the head of pharmacy role. He also recently had the opportunity to do a 5-week course, three evenings a week, on general principles of pharmacy management. It's given him a good basic knowledge and also helped Claire with some French acronyms for 'average monthly usage' and so on! Claire hopes that he'll be able to do more training to help him in his new role.

Claire has sent us the following praise and prayer points:

- Good and productive meetings with the Chadian officials and hospital partners
- Cleopas's evening class and the way he's getting to grips with his new role
- The first tranche of the donation from the Swiss has arrived
- The thousands of lives that the hospital had the privilege of helping during 2022
- That more suitable training courses can be found for Cleopas & that his confidence in leading the pharmacy team will continue to grow
- Ongoing governance changes at the hospital will be carried out sensitively and wisely
- That Audrey "ends well" his time Guinebor 2. He's been working at the hospital for almost 10 years
- Ongoing wisdom for the SMT
- For patients and caregivers to see the love of Christ demonstrated in all the hospital does
