

Learning from the miracles of Jesus

I am fascinated by the miracles of Jesus. What was it that actually happened to the molecules under the feet of Jesus as he walked on the water? The fluid dynamics I studied during my physics degree were also fascinating, but they don't give me an answer here.

Over the years people have suggested various things. Some people have suggested that there was a sandbank or that they were closer to the shore than they realised (which would be a denial of this miracle — so misses the point and can't be the correct interpretation), or that God put a really large fish there just at the right time (which would still be a miracle of timing — but unnecessarily denies the account of scripture and the actual miracle). The scriptures don't really give us a reason — nor do they need to. It just happened!

The scriptures focus on the consequences. As Jesus walked on the water he displayed to the disciples that he is Lord even over the natural order. What an incredible thing to witness. Peter — someone who had been around water his whole life, a fisherman, asks to step out onto the water. Peter then actually walks on water for a short time too.

We can have incredible and even miraculous experiences when we are in the presence of Jesus that encourage us and equip us for the challenges of the Christian life. It can be discouraging looking at the storms of life and situations in our lives and in the world. These miracles help us to believe that God has a plan and he is working it through to his glory and for the good of his people.

The response of the disciples that day was to bow down and worship Jesus, to put their trust even more deeply in him. When we find ourselves in the storms will we place our trust in Jesus?

Claire Bedford

Serving with BMS in Chad

Claire Bedford has been based at Guinebor II hospital in N'Djamenna, Chad (West Africa) since January 2016. Previously she trained and worked as a pharmacist in the UK. At Guinebor II she supervises the pharmacy and the lab as well as being a member

of the hospital's Senior Management Team alongside other long-term mission workers.

There are 123 staff at the hospital and Claire observes that running it is "no small task but with teamwork and God's grace, it happens, and patients continue to trust the hospital and come for care."

Although the hospital was founded and is run by Christians, they rarely get opportunities to talk freely about

their faith, relying instead on demonstrating God's love in their actions. However, Christmas affords a bit more opportunity to speak openly and at this year's Christmas party for staff, patients and caregivers, they were able to include a Gospel talk in Chadian Arabic by one of the chaplains. Christmas and the new year were also a great time of celebration in Claire's Chadian church. The pastor reminded them of the reality of spiritual warfare and the need to be grateful for God's constant protection and not take it for granted.

Although Claire continues to take a supervisory role in the pharmacy, she is increasingly able to leave the day to day running of it in the capable hands of Cleopas and his assistant Valerie, which frees her up to concentrate more on the management side of her role. The ceilings in the pharmacy are currently being renovated. Give thanks for this work and the improvement that it will bring, but pray for the safety of the construction team.

Claire has recently been joined at Guinebor II by fellow BMS missionaries Ingrid and Roger Hamlet, who are setting up a Prosthetics and Orthotics Department at the hospital this year. They and their two young sons are living in the house next to Claire's and she has been helping them to find their feet. She encourages us to pray that they would feel a part of the team and comfortable in their new life in Chad.
